

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Domestic Violence is defined as the **physical**, **psychological**, **emotional** or **sexual violence** within a current or former dating relationship. It can occur in person or electronically.



PHYSICAL

Hitting, Shoving, Slapping, Kicking

PSYCHOLOGICAL

Threatening to hurt themselves, you or others. Name calling, Shaming, Put Downs

SEXUAL

Forcing someone to engage in a sexual act when they do not consent, such as rape. Kissing or touching someone when they don't want it.

ELECTRONIC

Repeated texting and/or calling Posting sexual pictures of a partner online Posting lies about a partner online.

STALKING

A pattern or harrassing or threatning tactics that are unwanted and cause fear in the victim

DID YOU KNOW

- 1 in 3 young adults in the U.S. is a victim of physical, sexual, emotional or verbal abuse from a dating partner.
- Only 33% of adolences in an abusive relationship ever tell anyone about the abuse 75% tell a friend, 6% tell a family member and 3% tell an authorithy figure.
- 57% of adolences say they know of a peer who has been physically, sexually, or verbally abusive to their dating partner.
- Nearly half (43%) of dating college women report experiencing violent and abusive dating behaviors.
- The effects of an abusive relationship increase risk of becoming trapped in another unhealthy during college and adult years.
