Honoring a Legacy: The National Martin Luther King Jr. March on Jan. 20

Every January, we come together to celebrate the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Central to these celebrations is the National Martin Luther King Jr. March, taking place Monday, Jan. 20. The City of San Antonio hosts the largest MLK March in the nation commemorating Dr. King's pivotal role in the civil rights movement. From the Montgomery Bus Boycott to the historic 1963 March on Washington, where Dr. King delivered his iconic "I Have a Dream" speech, his leadership embodied the spirit of peaceful resistance and moral courage. Today, the march serves as a reminder that his dream—a society where individuals are judged by the content of their character rather than the color of their skin—remains a work in progress.

The National MLK Jr. March is more than a commemoration; it is an opportunity to reflect on the progress made and the challenges that persist. It calls participants to continue Dr. King's mission by addressing issues such as:

- Systemic inequality in education, healthcare, and the criminal justice system.
- Voting rights, which remain a cornerstone of democracy.
- Economic justice, including fair wages and access to opportunity for all communities.

Dr. King's legacy challenges us to stay vigilant and to work toward a society where equity is not an aspiration but a reality

How to Get Involved

- Join St. Philip's College for the Martin Luther King Jr. National Day of Service and March. The March will start at 10 A.M. from MLK Academy at 3500 MLK Drive to Pittman-Sullivan Park at 1101 Iowa Street.
- Volunteer: Engage in service projects such as food drives, community cleanups, or mentoring programs. MLK Day is also known as a National Day of Service.
- Educate Yourself: Attend SPC MLK Jr. and Black History Month such as lectures, workshops, or film screenings that explore civil rights history and its contemporary relevance.

As we march together on Jan. 20, let us remember that Dr. King's vision of a "Beloved Community" requires reflection and action. The march is a chance to recommit to the principles of nonviolence, empathy, and persistent advocacy for change. In Dr. King's Words:

"Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?"

Let this question guide us not only on MLK Day but throughout the year as we strive to build a better, more equitable world.

We march to honor his legacy. We march to create the future he dreamed of. Join us on Jan. 20.
