Top Skills Employers Want in Graduates:

James Cooper highlights the key skills that are essential for today's graduates. Employers seek candidates who are:

- Critical Thinkers: The ability to problem-solve and think analytically is in high demand.
- Equity & Inclusion Advocates: A commitment to diversity and fostering inclusive environments is essential.
- Leaders: Graduates who can motivate teams and take charge when needed stand out.
- Professional: Being dependable, ethical, and presenting yourself well are all part of the professional package.
- Team Players: Collaboration is key, and employers seek graduates who can work well with others.
- Tech-Savvy: Digital fluency is no longer optional in most industries.
- Excellent Communicators: Being able to communicate clearly and effectively in both writing and speaking is a must.

To become career-ready, it's not enough to just attend classes. James suggests students get involved on campus and take leadership roles to gain hands-on experience and build a professional network. Here are some ways to get started:

Avoiding Common Career Preparation Pitfalls

One of the most common mistakes students make is thinking that classroom learning is all they need to secure a job. James Cooper advises students to step outside the classroom by engaging in extracurricular activities, attending events, and making connections with peers and faculty. A well-rounded college experience is key to career success.

Balancing Academics with Practical Experience

It's important for students to find a balance between their academic responsibilities and gaining practical experience. James recommends that students seek jobs directly related to their major. For instance, if you're studying healthcare, try to gain experience in a healthcare setting, rather than working in a job unrelated to your field. By aligning work experience with academic goals, students build their resumes while learning on the job

Experiential Learning Opportunities at SPC
