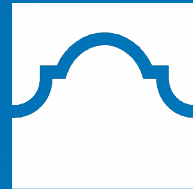

- Analyze, Classify, Correlate

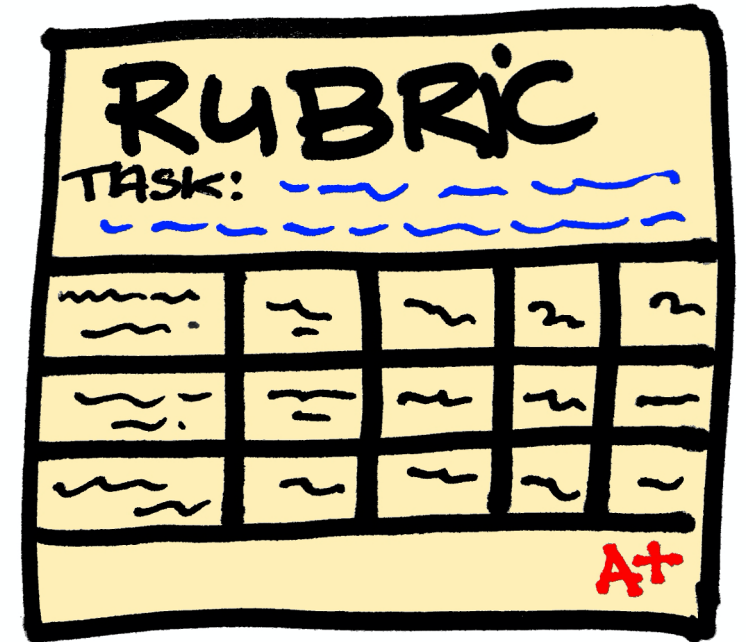

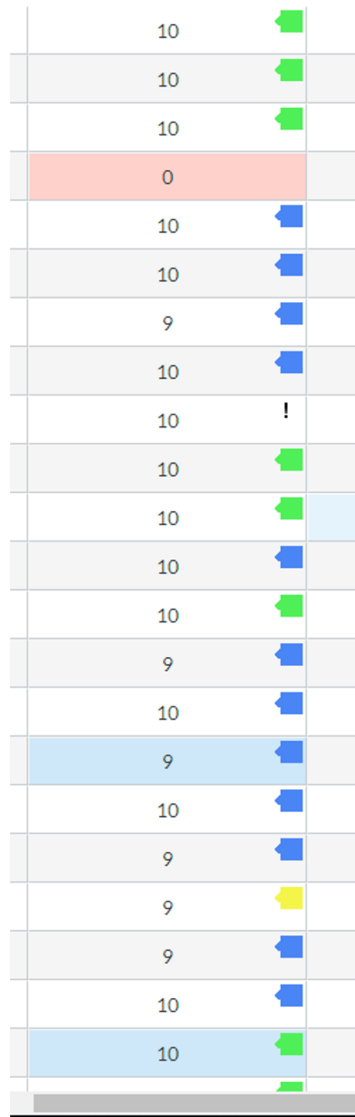

Topic: Should college tuition be free?

Propositional statement: College tuition shouldn't be free.

Organization: Monroe's Motivational Sequence

I. Introduction – Attention

A. Attention Getter: How many of you have to borrow money for living expenses?

B. Relevance: Free college has become one of the most talked about policy proposals on the campaign trail, but questions surround the policy, such as how it would work.

C. Credibility: personally, I saw so many people taking care of their homeworks, school work seriously because they are about their education, and they pay for the college fee. On the other hand, some people don't care because they said they can retake it anytime and they can ask for the money. I think this isn't fair.
