At St. Philip's College, academic and career advising builds a culture of integrated practices and shared responsibilities. Through collaborative teaching and learning, the advising process empowers our diverse student populations to explore and navigate their academic and career pathways.

SPC is committed to providing quality academic advising and information about available resources to support you with achieving your desired educational goal. We will guide and support your completion of a certificate and/or associate degree and transition to a four-year institution or entry into the workforce.

To get the most out of your advising session, as a student you are responsible for:

- Visiting with your Certified Academic Advisor.
 - Reading all your emails in ACES. This is the official communication method from SPC for students.
 - Meeting critical deadlines for registration, financial aid and payment deadlines, add/drops, and graduation application for completing your degree and/or certificate.
 - Being prepared to discuss goals and educational plans. Ask questions if something is not clear or you have a concern.
 - Being open and willing to consider all options and recommendations.
 - Being an engaged and active learner in your educational journey.
 - Inform your Certified Academic Advisor of important changes that directly affect your academic performance and educational goals.
 - Scheduling your advising appointment early in the semester.
 - Being courteous and respectful at all times.
 - Learning about academic programs and resources.
- Understanding the importance of ethical decision-making in your academic experience.
- Committing to an academic plan that supports certificate and/or degree completion and/or successful transfer.
 Commit to Completion.
- Understanding the importance of your degree plan as it pertains to non-accredited course work for completion.
- Being familiar with and abide by the SPC <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>
- Being proactive and monitor your academic progress in Alamo GPS via your ACES account.

As your Certified Academic Advisor, my commitment to you is to:

- Understand and effectively communicate the college's policies, core requirements, curriculum and certificate and/or degree requirements.
- Assist you with course selection based on educational and career goals.
- Encourage and guide you to define clear and realistic educational plans using your Alamo GPS.
- Ensure that you are part of the decision-making process, provide and understand your next steps.
- Provide you with an advising form with a checklist.
- Provide you with referrals when necessary.
- Listen carefully to your questions and concerns.
- Monitor and accurately document your academic progress.
- Maintain confidentiality following SPC and Federal Education Right to Privacy Act <u>FERPA</u> regulations.

As your Certified Academic Advisor, I will not:

- Provide mental health counseling, but will make referrals, when necessary.
- Register you for your classes.
- Choose your career or your classes for you.
- Initiate a course withdrawal for you.

Regardless of the number of hours completed, you should see your advisor when:

- Your cumulative grade point average (GPA) is in danger of falling below a 2.0.
- You are thinking about changing your career and educational goals.
- You are having trouble in any of your courses.
- You are thinking about dropping out of college.

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Academic Standards

Academic probation and academic dismissal could have serious consequences. If your cumulative grade point average (GPA) falls below 2.0, you will be placed on Academic Probation. You may be limited to 7-8 semester hours for the next semester and cannot take Maymester or summer classes. If in the next semester your GPA is still below 2.0, you will be placed on Academic Dismissal. Your GPA and your Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) can have negative consequences on your financial aid, choice of universities, future programs, and certificate and/or degree completion.
